It's about a 50 minute drive from King's Lynn and is off the A1067, the road which runs between Norwich and Fakenham. The shortest route from King's Lynn is via the A148 to Fakenham and then the A1067. Turn left into Foxley Village at the brown sign for Foxley Wood.

Arrival time is after 2:00pm on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> May (Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> for Jean & Keith). The keys for the cottages will be in the doors so you don't need to check in with anyone but there is an office at the farm. See the site maps for the location of that and all the cottages. Two of them are located near the entrance to the village rather than on the farm. If you are the first to arrive please arrange with your housemates about access if you go away. If you're not sure where to go contact Kelvin on 07816 110 108 or Gillian on 07768 924 478. Departure is by 10:00am on whichever day you leave.

As usual the allocations of people to the accommodation units is just a suggestion, mainly because the proprietors require names for each unit's residents. You can swap around if you like. The numbers in each unit should not exceed those shown below. Bedding is provided for everyone (but not all the beds). **You do need to bring your own towels.** You don't need to bring anything else except your food and washing up things (including tea towels). Electricity, heating and hot water are included but Stable Cottages 3, 4, 7 and 8 have a £1 coin meter for electricity. You'll only need £2 for the whole weekend.

The equipment inventory is not as good as we've had the last few years. You might want to bring pint glasses, for instance, and potato peelers are always inadequate in these places. Don't forget your swimming costume if you want to use the indoor pool and spa bath.

As to cost, the accommodation for three or four nights will be £92 per person. Tower donations for the weekend will be £6, so the total is £98. If you are arranging your own accommodation or just coming for bits of the ringing the tower donations will be £6 for all twelve towers or 50 new pence per tower visited. Please could you pay this very soon after the weekend (not before) preferably with a bank transfer but cheques or cash are fine if that's better for you.

This accommodation might not be as good for communal gatherings as in some previous years because of the split site. They are five minutes walk apart. Please be especially careful about returning equipment to their rightful places. The biggest unit by far is Church Farm Barn, which is one of the two not on the farm.

Hope that's all clear. If there's anything you need to ask, please do.

Stable Cottage 8 (maximum 4 in one double, one twin):- Alex, John.

Stable Cottage 7 (maximum 4 in one double, one bunk):- Fleur.

Stable Cottage 4 (maximum 4 in one double, two singles):- Caroline, Cathy.

Stable Cottage 3 (maximum 4 in one double, 1 twin):- Jean, Keith.

Pond Cottage (maximum 4 in one double, two singles):- Gillian, Kelvin, Emily, Rachael.
